



The *Shoshone County Courthouse*, designed by L.R. Stritesky and Sweatt of Spokane in 1905, is a three-story building sitting on a raised foundation. Constructed of painted concrete block made from ore tailings, the building is rendered in a Neo-classical Revival style. It is distinguished by its two-story round-arched window above the central entry with its balustraded balcony supported by modillions. Other attractive features include the non-derivative fluted pilasters, denticulated cornice and high parapet.
